Re: Demand for civil penalty and compliance with the Campaign Reporting Act

Dear Mr. Thornton and Ms. Ridley,

I am an attorney for the New Mexico State Ethics Commission, an independent state agency authorized to enforce the civil compliance provisions of New Mexico's Campaign Reporting Act. *See* N.M. Const. Art. V, § 17; NMSA 1978, § 1-19-34.6(C) (2021); NMSA 1978, § 10-16G-9(A)(1) & (F) (2021). I write to you in your capacity as organizer and treasurer, respectively, of the New Mexico Values PAC, and in this letter I will refer to you collectively as "New Mexico Values PAC."

It has come to the State Ethics Commission's attention that the week before the June 7, 2022 Primary Election, New Mexico Values PAC mailed campaign advertisements opposing the election of Representative Susan Herrera, then a candidate for the Democratic Primary of the New Mexico House of Representatives. Because these mailers referred to a clearly identified candidate within thirty days of a primary election, they were independent expenditures. *See* NMSA 1978, § 1-19-26(N)(3)(c) (2019).

The Campaign Reporting Act requires that any person making an independent expenditure of more than \$1,000 in a nonstatewide election that is "not otherwise required to be reported" by the Act disclose information about the expenditures and the sources of contributions used to fund those expenditures. *See* NMSA 1978, § 1-19-27.3 (2019). Such disclosures should be made within three days of making the expenditure. *See* § 1-19-27.3(A). New Mexico Values PAC disclosed that it made one expenditure on the campaign advertisements targeting Representative Herrera on June 1, 2022; thus, it was required to disclose information about that

expenditure on June 4, 2022, before the 2022 primary election. *See* § 1-19-27.3(A). Instead of disclosing information about the independent expenditure targeting Representative Herrera within three days of making it, as Section 1-19-27.3 requires, New Mexico Values PAC instead disclosed information about the independent expenditure on July 7, 2022 in a Fourth Primary Report—over a month after making the independent expenditure and after the June 2022 primary election had occurred.

While a political committee’s contributions and expenditures are “otherwise required to be reported” according to NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-29 (2019), and NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-31 (2019), a political committee is defined as an association of two or more people who “received more than five thousand dollars in contributions or made independent expenditures of more than five thousand dollars in the election cycle.” NMSA 1978, § 1-19-26(Q)(4) (2019). New Mexico Values PAC did not receive more than \$5,000 in contributions or make more than \$5,000 in expenditures during the 2022 election cycle; consequently, New Mexico Values PAC is not a political committee under Section 1-19-26(Q)(4). Nor do the other definitions of a political committee in Section 1-19-26 encompass New Mexico Values PAC. Because New Mexico Values PAC was not a political committee, the disclosure of its contributions and expenditures were not “otherwise required to be reported” according to Section 1-19-31. As a result, Section 1-19-27.3 required New Mexico Values PAC to report information about its June 1, 2022 independent expenditure targeting Representative Herrera within three days of making it.

There are two additional issues with New Mexico Values PAC’s disclosures. First, in its disclosure report, New Mexico Values PAC disclosed that it received \$2,500.00 from Community Empowerment Fund on June 1, 2022, and further identified one lump-sum expenditure, in the amount of \$2,432.91, also on June 1, 2022, to the United States Postal Service as the “entity to whom an expenditure was made” for the purpose of “Campaign paraphernalia/misc.” New Mexico Values PAC did not disclose any other expenditures or in-kind contributions regarding the funding, design, production, printing, and mailing of the advertisements on June 1, 2022. In order to accomplish producing, printing, addressing, and sending the campaign advertisements, it is unlikely that New Mexico Values PAC made only the one expenditure to the post office, meaning it made other expenditures or received other in-kind contributions, which were unreported.

Second, the timing of New Mexico Values PAC’s purported registration as a political committee on May 24, 2022, the contribution from Community Empower Fund to New Mexico Values PAC (reported as received on June 1, 2022), New Mexico Values PAC’s sole disclosed expenditure on that same day, New Mexico Values PAC’s June 2, 2022 Third Primary Report disclosing no expenditures for May 2022, and New Mexico Values PAC’s post-election disclosure on July 7, 2022 suggest that New Mexico Values PAC purported to register as a political committee and then made expenditures with an intent to conceal, until after the June 2022 primary election, the names of the persons who were the source of the funds used to make the independent expenditures, in violation of NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-34.3(B) (2019).

Under Section 1-19-34.6(C), the State Ethics Commission may

institute a civil action in district court if a violation has occurred
Relief may include a permanent or temporary injunction, a restraining order or any other appropriate order, including an order for a civil penalty of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each violation not to exceed a total of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).

Considering this provision and the foregoing, the Commission has authorized its attorney staff to commence a civil action against you. *See* Attach. 1, Draft Compl.; *see also* Ex. 1 to Attach. 1, Resolution No. 2023-02 (June 2, 2023).

I. Offer of settlement

The Commission has also authorized settlement with you. To avoid the expense and burden of litigation, the Commission through its Executive Director will agree to forebear from filing a civil enforcement action if, by August 1, 2023, you agree to the following terms:

- By August 15, 2023, you register New Mexico Values PAC with the Office of the Secretary of State as an independent expenditure filer and disclose all expenditures New Mexico Values PAC made and contributions it received during the 2022 election cycle, providing a copy of the disclosure form to the State Ethics Commission upon filing; and
- By August 15, 2023, New Mexico Values PAC or its agent delivers by hand delivery or U.S. Mail to the State Ethics Commission, 800 Bradbury Dr. SE, Suite 215, Albuquerque, New Mexico, 87106, a \$1,000.00 civil penalty made payable to the State of New Mexico.

II. Demand for preservation of evidence

New Mexico law recognizes a duty not to destroy, mutilate, or alter potential evidence for the purpose of defeating recovery in a civil action. Accordingly, please take immediate action to preserve all electronically stored information (“ESI”), copies and backup, along with any paper files which you maintain, that might contain evidence related to this matter. Accordingly, I request that you immediately take the following actions:

- a. You immediately stop any destruction or alteration of documents or ESI in your possession, custody or control, including e-mail, instant messages, text messages, voice mail, electronic calendars, telephone logs, photographs, word processing documents, spreadsheets, and databases, including all underlying metadata, that might be relevant to this matter.
- b. You immediately take steps to secure and preserve any ESI, backup tapes, hard drives, CDs, paper and other archival storage media in your possession, custody or control, including those provided by third-party vendors, that might be relevant to this matter.

Failure to respond to these demands may lead to investigative or enforcement actions by the State Ethics Commission.

COMPLAINT

1. In the days leading up to the last primary election, Defendants mailed campaign advertisements opposing the election of a candidate for the New Mexico House of Representatives but failed to make the disclosures required by the Campaign Reporting Act.

2. The Legislature’s 2019 overhaul of the Campaign Reporting Act reinforced its intent to shine light on “dark money” in state elections, requiring more transparency from groups that fund campaign advertisements, including disclosures of their expenditures and the sources of contributions used to fund those expenditures. *See* Laws 2019, ch. 262, §§ 1–18; *see also* NMSA 1978, § 1-19-26.1 (requiring registration of political committees); § 1-19-27.3 (requiring disclosures related to independent expenditures); § 1-19-31 (identifying the specific information required in a report of expenditures and contributions).

3. Defendants spent thousands of dollars on an advertising campaign in opposition to Representative Susan Herrera, a candidate for the June 2022 Democratic primary for the New Mexico House of Representatives. Despite the transparency requirements of the Campaign Reporting Act, Defendants did not timely disclose who ultimately funded the advertising

campaign, depriving the voters in House District 41 of information that the Campaign Reporting Act requires that they have *before* the election.

4. Plaintiff State Ethics Commission brings this complaint against Defendants to require their compliance with the Campaign Reporting Act and for civil penalties authorized under that Act. In support of these claims, the Commission states as follows:

PARTIES

5. Plaintiff State Ethics Commission is an independent state agency established by Article V, Section 17(A) of the State Constitution. On June 2, 2023, at an open meeting, the Commission authorized a civil enforcement action against Defendants for violations of the Campaign Reporting Act. *See* Ex. 1, State Ethics Comm'n Res. No. 2023-02 (July 2, 2023).

6. Defendant New Mexico Values PAC is a New Mexico entity that spent more than \$1,000 in a non-statewide election before the June 2022 primary election, but that did not receive or spend more than \$5,000.

7. Defendant Ridley is identified as the treasurer for the New Mexico Values PAC and upon information and belief is a resident of Travis County, Texas.

8. Defendant Thornton is identified as the organizer for the New Mexico Values PAC and upon information and belief, is a resident of Bernalillo County, New Mexico.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

9. The Court has jurisdiction for this action pursuant to Article VI, Section 13, of the New Mexico Constitution.

10. Venue is proper in this judicial district.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS COMMON TO ALL CLAIMS

11. On May 24, 2022, Defendants filed a Political Committee Registration Form with the New Mexico Secretary of State, indicating it was a “new registration.” *See* Ex. 2, Political Committee Registration Form, Office of the Secretary of State (May 24, 2022).

12. On June 2, 2022, Defendants filed their Third Primary Report as a Statement of No Activity for the period of May 3, 2022 through May 31, 2022, which documents no contributions and no expenditures. *See* Ex. 3, Third Primary Report, Office of the Secretary of State (June 2, 2022).

13. The week before the June 7, 2022 Primary Election, full-color mailers opposing Representative Herrera were sent to voters in northern New Mexico.

14. The mailers identified a number of different votes Representative Herrera took while in the New Mexico House of Representatives, spanning 2020 through 2022, and including the senate or house bill number and the subject matter of those votes.

15. The mailers indicate they were “Paid for by: The New Mexico Values PAC.”

16. On July 7, 2022, the Defendants filed the New Mexico Values PAC’s Fourth Primary Report – the report’s only disclosure of contributions and expenditures (other than bank fees) during the 2022 primary and general election cycles. *See* Ex. 4, Fourth Primary Report, Office of the Secretary of State (July 7, 2022).

17. The July 7, 2022 Fourth Primary Report states that Defendants received a \$2,500 contribution from Community Empowerment Fund on June 1, 2022, days after Defendants purported to file a registration with the Secretary of State. *See id.* at 3.

18. The July 7, 2022 Fourth Primary Report documents just one expenditure by Defendants, also on June 1, 2022. The amount of the expenditure is listed as \$2,432.92, for the Purpose of “Campaign paraphernalia/misc” and with the “Name and Address of Payee” listed as the United States Post Office. *See id.* at 7.

19. New Mexico Values PAC has identified no other contributions or expenditures, other than bank fees, in any of its subsequent reports. *See, e.g.,* Ex. 5, First General Report, Office of the Secretary of State (Sept. 13, 2022); Ex. 6, Second General Report, Office of the Secretary of State (Oct. 7, 2022); Ex. 7, Third General Report, Office of the Secretary of State (Nov. 3, 2022); Ex. 8, Fourth General Report, Office of the Secretary of State (Jan. 9, 2023);

Count I
Failure to timely report independent expenditures required under
NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-27.3

20. Plaintiff State Ethics Commission incorporates by reference the foregoing paragraphs of this complaint as though fully set forth herein.

21. The mailers paid for by Defendants are communications referring to a candidate within thirty days of an election and therefore constitute independent expenditures under NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-26(N)(3)(c).

22. Defendants made independent expenditures during the 2022 election cycle that exceed at least one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

23. New Mexico Values PAC did not receive more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in contributions or make independent expenditures of more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in the election cycle and, therefore, does not meet the definition of a political committee under NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-26(Q).

24. New Mexico Values PAC did not meet the definition of a political committee, and, thus, because Defendants' independent expenditures were not otherwise required to be reported under the Campaign Reporting Act, Defendants were required to report the expenditures under the provisions of NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-27.3(A).

25. Defendants therefore were required to file a disclosure report as independent expenditure filers under NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-27.3(A), within three days of such expenditure.

26. Defendants did not file a disclosure report as independent expenditure filers within three days of such expenditure and, thereby, violated NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-27.3(A).

Count II
Expenditures with an intent to conceal the true source of the funds in violation of
NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-34.3

27. Plaintiff incorporates by reference the foregoing paragraphs of this complaint as though fully set forth herein.

28. Instead of filing a disclosure report as independent expenditure filers *before* the primary election, Defendants purported to register as a political committee, despite not meeting the definition of a political committee under NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-26(Q).

29. Having purported to register as a political committee, Defendants made contribution and expenditure disclosures related to the advertisement opposing Representative Herrera on July 7, 2022, a month *after* the June 2022 primary election and more than a month after they were required to report their independent expenditures.

30. On July 7, 2022, Defendants disclosed that New Mexico Value PAC received a single \$2,500 contribution on June 1, 2022, from Community Empower Fund, a domestic nonprofit corporation organized “to engage in public policy advocacy, grassroots organizing.”

31. Upon information and belief, rather than disclose the expenditures as independent expenditures before the June 2022 primary election, as required by the Campaign Reporting Act, Defendants purported to register the New Mexico Values PAC as a political committee in order to avoid disclosing, before the June 2022 primary election, that Community Empowerment Fund was the source of their independent expenditures.

32. Upon information and belief, by purporting to register as a political committee and by make disclosures *after* the June 2022 primary election, Defendants made expenditures on advertisements with an intent to conceal, until after the June 2022 primary election, the names of

the persons who are the source of funds used to make independent expenditures or the true recipients of the expenditures, in violation of NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-34.3(B).

Count III
Failure to disclose expenditures or contributions, in violation of
NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-27.3

33. Plaintiff incorporates by reference the foregoing paragraphs of this complaint as though fully set forth herein.

34. Section 1-19-27.3 of the Campaign Reporting Act requires that an entity making independent expenditures must state “the name and address of the person to whom the independent expenditure was made and the amount, date and purpose of the independent expenditure,” NMSA 1978, § 1-19-27.3(B)(2), and the “source of contributions used to make the independent expenditure[,] NMSA 1978, § 1-19-27.3(B)(3).

35. In its disclosure report, New Mexico Values PAC identified one lump-sum expenditure to the United States Postal Service as the “entity to whom an expenditure was made” for the purpose of “Campaign paraphernalia/misc.”

36. Defendants did not disclose any other expenditures or in-kind contributions regarding the funding, design, production, printing, addressing, and mailing of the advertisements in a single day—June 1, 2022.

37. Upon information and belief, Defendants made additional expenditures or received additional in-kind contributions which were not reported, in violation of NMSA 1978, § 1-19-31.

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, the State Ethics Commission requests the Court to enter relief as follows:

- a. Injunctive relief ordering Defendants to comply with the reporting requirements of NMSA 1978, Sections 1-19-27.3 and 1-19-31;

- b. Civil penalties allowed by NMSA 1978, Section 1-19-34.6(B)-(C), for a minimum of three violations of the Campaign Reporting Act, up to a maximum of \$20,000;
- c. Assessment of costs under NMSA 1978, Section 34-6-40.1; and
- d. Such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

**Resolution No. 2023-02: Authorizing a demand and
civil action to enforce the Campaign Reporting Act**

WHEREAS, THE NEW MEXICO STATE ETHICS COMMISSION (“Commission”) met at the New Mexico Department of Agriculture, 3190 S. Espina St., Las Cruces, N.M., 88001, on June 2, 2023, at 9:00 a.m.;

WHEREAS, the Commission has the power to investigate violations and bring a civil action to enforce the Campaign Reporting Act;

WHEREAS, the Commission has reason to believe that the New Mexico Values PAC and individuals associated therewith, including its organizer and treasurer, violated Sections 1-19-27.3 and 1-19-34.3 of the Campaign Reporting Act;

WHEREAS, the Executive Director has sought the approval of the Commission to initiate a civil action under NMSA 1978, Sections 1-19-34.6(B) and 10-16G-9(F) against the New Mexico Values PAC and the individuals associated therewith, including its organizer and treasurer, and has explained the proposed civil action and remedies to be sought, to civil penalties, injunctive relief, and other equitable remedies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the New Mexico State Ethics Commission:


1. The Commission’s staff are authorized to demand that the New Mexico Values PAC and individuals associated therewith, including its organizer and

treasurer, comply with the Campaign Reporting Act and to prepare and file a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking to enforce the civil compliance provisions of the Campaign Reporting Act and any other relief that the court deems just and proper.

2. If Commission staff file a lawsuit against the New Mexico Values PAC and individuals associated therewith, including its organizer and treasurer, then the Executive Director is instructed to provide regular updates on the status of the suit at the Commission's meetings during closed session. Commission staff shall communicate with the Chair as necessary between Commission meetings.

3. The Executive Director is authorized to enter an agreement to settle or dismiss claims brought against the New Mexico Values PAC and individuals associated therewith, including its organizer and treasurer, upon having conferred with the Chair or his designee.
