RESOLUTION NO. 2026-03 Authorizing petition to district court for the issuance of subpoenas related to the enforcement of the Nondisclosure of Sensitive Personal Information Act.

WHEREAS, THE NEW MEXICO STATE ETHICS COMMISSION (“Commission”) met virtually on February 13, 2026, at 9:00 a.m.;

WHEREAS, the Commission is authorized pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 10-16G-5(C)(2), to petition a district court to issue subpoenas under seal requiring the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records, documents, or other evidence relevant or material to an investigation;

WHEREAS, the Commission has adopted rules at 1.8.1.11(C) NMAC permitting the Executive Director, upon approval of the Commission, to file an action in district court for the issuance, service, and enforcement of subpoenas;

WHEREAS, the Executive Director has requested authorization to petition a New Mexico district court for subpoenas duces tecum in furtherance of an ongoing investigation concerning potential violations of the Nondisclosure of Sensitive Personal Information Act, NMSA 1978, §§ 10-16I-1 to -4;


WHEREAS, information received by Commission staff indicates that text message communications between a federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement agent and New Mexico Corrections Department Probation and

Parole officers may be relevant or material to the investigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the New Mexico State Ethics Commission:

1. The Executive Director is authorized to prepare, file, and litigate a petition in a district court of competent jurisdiction for the issuance of subpoenas under seal, consistent with NMSA 1978, § 10-16G-5(C)(2), and 1.8.1.11(C) NMAC.
2. Any subpoenas sought pursuant to this Resolution shall be narrowly tailored to obtain testimony and records relevant or material to the investigation.
3. The Executive Director shall provide updates to the Commission regarding the status of the matter, as appropriate and consistent with applicable confidentiality requirements.
